Bellevue Family,

For the past two years, we have had a rotating emphasis for Missions Week. In 2022 we highlighted Bellevue's ministry in the United States and focused on church-planting efforts across the U.S. In 2023 we challenged you to engage in the missionary task as we looked at global lostness and the need for more international missionaries.

This year we ask you to turn your eyes closer to home. Our deepest desire is that every Bellevue member will engage in God's great mission to reach the lost with the Good News of Jesus Christ; we want you to do this across the world and across your street. This year's Missions Week is designed to help you see how you can engage in the missionary task in Memphis.

If you look at the needs in our city, it is easy to be overwhelmed with how great they are. A few years ago we looked at the poverty, crime, and lostness of our city, and we asked, "Lord, where do you want us to begin?" We went to the Bible to find our answer. After looking at Scripture, we believe we must focus our efforts on three areas: Cordova, compassion ministry, and church development. Anchoring our ministry to those pillars helps us strategically take the Gospel to our neighbors, to the vulnerable, and across Memphis and the Mid-South.

In this magazine you will see our local missions strategy further explained, and you will also see a glimpse of the great need for Memphis to hear the Gospel. God has intentionally placed Bellevue on Appling Road in Cordova, Tennessee, to be a light in this community. He has sent **you** to this city to be Christ's witness here. As you consider how you will engage in missions locally in 2024, we challenge you to ask the same question we did—"Lord, where do you want me to begin?" We are here to encourage you and guide you as you step out in obedience.

Ocal Missions Strategy

CORDOVA

"Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf; for in its welfare you will have welfare." Jeremiah 29:7

Every week our church gathers in Cordova, but there are thousands living in this city who drive past our building and never enter. What would happen if Bellevue closed its doors? Would Cordova notice any difference? In Jeremiah 29:7 God tells His people they are a sent people—sent by God into exile to seek the city's welfare. In the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18–20), we see again that God's people are a sent people—Jesus' disciples must go into the world to make disciples of all nations. God has sent Bellevue to Cordova to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We cannot neglect to take the Gospel to those right across our street.

COMPASSION

"The Lord of Armies says this: 'Make fair decisions. Show faithful love and compassion to one another. Do not oppress the widow or the fatherless, the resident alien or the poor, and do not plot evil in your hearts against one another.'" Zechariah 7:9-10 CSB

One way God's people should be distinct is in the way they treat vulnerable and suffering people. In the Old Testament, there were laws that protected widows, orphans, sojourners, and the poor. In the New Testament, Jesus affirms that when believers care for the hungry, the thirsty, the homeless, and those in prison, we show we are one of His followers (Matthew 25:31–46; Luke 10:25–37). This type of ministry is called "compassion ministry" because it requires one's heart to be moved to action by another person's suffering. When we were hopeless in our sin, Jesus had compassion on us. Shouldn't we show compassion to the vulnerable around us?

CHURCHES

"For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another." Romans 12:4-5

Since God gave believers the Holy Spirit during Pentecost, the local church has been God's primary way of spreading the Gospel. In Acts 13, the church at Antioch sent Paul and Barnabas to make disciples in other cities. More churches were formed, and those churches made more disciples. God has placed churches throughout Memphis and the Mid-South, and Bellevue seeks to partner with and encourage those churches so we can engage our city with the Gospel. The more healthy churches there are, the more Jesus is shared. Imagine—what if every church in Memphis worked together to make disciples? Memphis would be different.
