



Course Title: Humanities 4

### Humanities Courses Overview

The Humanities courses, built on *The Mystery of History* series, invite students to explore world history through the lens of a biblical worldview. Humanities 4 uses the *Mystery of History, Volume IV* text and is designed to fulfill high school requirements for world history and geography, while offering a rich, interdisciplinary experience that integrates art, music, and literature. Through projects, activities, and discussions, students engage with history not as distant facts, but as living stories that illuminate the connections between faith, culture, and human achievement.

### Description:

In Humanities 4, students will deepen their understanding of the complexities of history, recognize God's hand in global events, and develop a biblical perspective on the challenges and changes of the modern world. Using the *Mystery of History, Volume VI*, this course explores revolutions, wars of independence, industrial and technological advances, and the shaping of nations across the globe – all through the lens of a biblical worldview. Students will study influential figures such as Napoleon, Darwin, Lincoln, and Churchill, while connecting world events with God's ongoing work in history. Class discussions, projects, and weekly assignments encourage students to think critically about modern history and to recognize humanity's continued need for Christ.

Daily at-home readings and assignments build knowledge and connections, while hands-on learning through maps and enrichment activities deepen engagement and bring history to life.
