



Course Title: Math 6

Description:

This course is a precursor math course for fifth and sixth grade students before taking Math Fundamentals. Students will build on the mathematical foundations of multiplication, division, and place value, and to develop the student's understanding of geometry, fractions, decimals, ratios, and measurements. Students read and interpret a variety of graphs and charts. Additional topics covered will include the four math operations, problem solving, decimals, graphing, fractions, using calculators, and some geometry.

Prerequisites: Readiness for classroom math teaching with homework
