Week 2 Judges 1-2

- **I. Judges 1** The first chapter is the historical description of Israel's occupation of the Promised Land. It is their accounting of why they did not complete the mission to which God had called them.
- **II. Judges 2** Heaven's assessment of their occupation. God spoke and said, "You have not obeyed me".

Judges 2:10 – "All that generation also were gathered to their fathers; and there arose another generation after them who did not know the Lord, nor yet the work which He had done for Israel."

These were not innocent people that Israel was driving out. These were wicked people that God was using Israel to bring judgment upon. We are no longer dispensers of judgment, but of mercy. IV. Judges 3:5-8 - 1st Sin Cycle

How did they get here? How do we? One. Step. At. A. Time.

Every step of compromise will ultimately lead to depravity. Depravity, which is fueled by rebellion and choosing to create life outside the garden apart from God, always leads to the oppression of the weak. Small areas of disbelief lead ultimately to sinful enslavement.

The people said, "We can't" and God said, "No, you won't". "Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord of hosts" (Zechariah 4:6).

Everyone is broken. If you don't think someone is, then it is simply because you don't know them that well.

We don't serve God in our own strength, just like we weren't saved in our own strength. Remember Jericho.

How are we compromising?

"But I have to cheat to get ahead"

"I can't tell the truth, or I will be penalized"

"I know this relationship doesn't honor Christ but I am afraid of being lonely."

"I know the Bible says my behavior is sinful, but..."

"Did God say?"

"You surely will not die."

"God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." (Gen. 3:1-4)

We cannot break God's laws without them breaking us!
