



Course Title: Humanities 2

Description:

The humanities series of classes are designed to give students the opportunity to study and discuss world history with a biblical worldview plus so much more. This class will allow student to experience history through literature, geography, and the arts. Intended to meet the requirements for middle school social studies as well as literature, this course integrates various activities, projects, and subjects to help history come to life! The in-class instruction and discussions are designed to help students see the hand of God in the early church as it grew, expanded, and faced adversity. The humanities courses will explore civilization throughout the entire span of human history with the acclaimed Mystery of History series of texts.

In Humanities 2, students will continue their studies of history, Bible, and world geography with the formation of the early church and end with the fall of the Western Roman Empire and the Dark Ages. Covering the Early Church and Middle Ages, Vol II of the Mystery of History series introduces students to knights and damsels, kings and queens, and the peasants who faithfully served them. Students will hear the voice of God as He speaks through missionaries like Columba, St. Patrick, and Cyril and learn about the famous characters and events of this exciting period of history. The tutor will incorporate literature that will enrich interest and broaden understanding of the content. Students will work daily on at-home assignments and readings. Hands-on learning through maps and activities will also be included.
