Week of March 12: The Temptation of Jesus Matthew 4:1–11

ASK interactive questions.

- 1. How did Satan seek to tempt Jesus?
- 2. Why do you think Satan wanted to tempt Jesus to do the wrong thing?
- 3. When are you the most tempted to do the wrong thing? Why?

BRING your understanding.

Share one thing you learned about Jesus being tempted from your adult Life Group lesson.

CREATE fun experiences.

Activity: Blast of Temptation

Supplies: Foam dart blasters, eye protection, and one pillow

Before the activity, collect a foam dart blaster for every member of your family and a pillow. Tell your family that one parent will stand on one side of the room with a pillow and everyone else will stand on the other side of the room with foam dart blasters. Every family member will take four shots at the parent with the pillow, who will attempt to dodge away from and block the darts. Whoever hits the parent with their darts the most is the winner!

After the activity, explain to your family that the darts represent temptations to sin while the pillow represents God's Word. Whenever we're hit with temptation, knowing (and using) God's truth helps us block temptation, so we can obey God in everything we do.

Read Psalm 119:11: "Your word I have treasured in my heart, that I may not sin against You."
