Activity: Time To Give

Supplies: Cleaning supplies, paper, a pen, and a large cup

Before the activity, write down a list of tasks to accomplish around the house, and assign a monetary amount to each task. The amount can range anywhere from 50 cents to \$10, or it can be any other amount that fits your budget. Cut the list of tasks into individual slips of paper, with one task per slip, and place them inside a cup.

Gather your family, and inform them that they have the opportunity to earn and give some money. Instruct them to each pull out a slip of paper and accomplish the task they pulled out. As each person finishes their task, pay them for what they have accomplished. After all the tasks have been completed, instruct everyone to set aside 10% of what they earned for a tithe. Next, ask everyone how much of the rest of their earnings they would like to give to help someone in need. Gather their gifts, and together, choose a local ministry to whom the money will be given. Whether you give the money online or in person, ensure that your children participate in the act.
