Go! Imagine – Language Arts:

Language Arts can and should be fun for the 1st and 2nd grade student. In Go! Imagine we will introduce and practice basic concepts in reading, writing, and critical listening and speaking skills. Imagination is the key to creativity in young minds and our students will gain experience and confidence in the language arts through various modes of lessons, practice, and of course lots of games. This active and fun hour will complement the student’s reading lessons at home and composition in Go! as a 3rd/4th grade Pioneer.

Go! Explore – History:
