*"Be kind and compassionate to one another."* Ephesians 4:32

*"Encourage one another."* 1 Thessalonians 4:18

*"Live in harmony with one another."* Romans 12:16

*"Submit to one another."* Ephesians 5:21

*"Pray for one another."* James 5:16

*Building Faith at Home*

God designed the Body of Christ to include different parts. How funny would a body look if it were only made of hands? Our differences should complement one another. We can accomplish more for God's kingdom when the different parts of the body work together.

This Family Wreath activity provides opportunities to practice your "one anothers." (Examples of wreaths can be viewed at [bellevue.org/homepoint](http://bellevue.org/homepoint))

1. Cut a hole in the center of a paper plate. This will provide the foundation for your wreath.
2. Trace each other's hands and cut them out. (You could use other shapes such as leaves, circles, etc.) You should cut a minimum of 8-10 hands.
3. Write a person's name on each hand. Names could include each of your family members, school teachers, church leaders, friends, governmental leaders, etc.
4. Under each name, write why you are thankful for that person and one prayer request for him/her.
5. Take a moment to pray for each individual as you glue the shapes to your paper circle, making a wreath.

Hang this wreath as a reminder of the benefits of being in relationship and fellowship with others. Each day, pray for a name on your wreath. Thank God for the blessing they are to you.
